| 2                         | <p>Please tell us if this is a new or existing project. If this is an existing project, how will you develop it or make it different?</p> <p>(300 words maximum)</p>   |
| 3                         | <p>How have people aged 50 and over been involved in the project idea?</p> <p>We want to know how the project has been informed and developed with older people, and how they will continue to be involved during delivery (400 words maximum)</p>   |
| 4                         | <p>We want to know who the people are that will take part in this project, please answer part A or B</p> <p>A. If the project is open to all people aged 50 and over in the local neighbourhood, what are you doing to engage them and make it accessible to as wide a range of people as possible?</p> <p>B. If the project is targeted at marginalised communities, for example, people who experience racial inequalities, those who have disabilities or people from LGBTQ communities, what are you doing to reach and engage those communities?</p> <p>(500 words maximum)</p> |

### Assessment Criteria

NB – We are looking to invest in projects that support the widest range of people. This will involve scoring proposals to reflect our priorities which are reaching people aged 50 and over from marginalised communities who are at higher risk of social isolation. We will not be scoring individual questions in isolation but awarding points based on the following criteria.
